Parenting through Separation

Putting children first





Separating from your partner?

Separating from your partner can be stressful but when children are involved, the process can be even harder.

Parenting through Separation is a free information programme, funded by the Ministry of Justice, that helps you focus on what's best for your children when you separate.

Anyone involved in parenting arrangements for children can attend, including separating or separated parents, grandparents and other family/whānau members. The course is free.

Programme topics

Parenting through Separation focuses on the wellbeing of your children.

It covers topics like:

- how separation affects children
- talking with children about separation
- talking with ex-partners about arrangements for the children
- how to make a parenting plan
- keeping children away from conflict
- support services in your local community
- how the Family Court works

You'll also be given free take-home material that will help you and your children deal with separation.



What happens at the programme?

You'll be in a small group with up to 10 people. A trained programme leader will provide information and you will be able to discuss parenting issues and ask questions if you wish. The programme takes about four hours, usually in two sessions of two hours each.

Who else will be there?

The programme is for adults at any stage of separating. Children do not attend, but grandparents and other family/whānau members may attend if they are involved in your children's care. Your new partner can attend too.

Everyone who attends the programme is asked to provide photo identification. At the end of the course, you will receive a certificate confirming your attendance.

Will my ex-partner be there?

No. It is best for both parents to attend the programme but at different times. The programme is designed to help you focus on your children's needs during separation. Family dispute resolution can be organised if you and your ex-partner need help agreeing on how your children will be cared for.

How do I get to a programme?
