## Family Works Social Workers in Schools (SWiS)

Some kids struggle at school – they may be withdrawn or aggressive, being bullied or bullying others, disruptive or unnoticed, not getting on well with others or slipping behind in their schoolwork.

Social Workers in Schools are qualified social workers who work in partnership with families and schools so children can learn, grow and thrive.

- We identify the obstacles that prevent children from learning.
- We work with schools and parents to support children to overcome these obstacles.
- We help keep children safe from further harm.
- We link children and families with other agencies and support.

**This is a free service for children/ tamariki in Year 1 to 8 and their families/ whānau in your school/kura.**

## How we can help

Here are some of the obstacles that make it difficult for children to learn and thrive:

- Family violence
- Emotional or psychological abuse
- Neglect
- Alcohol or drug abuse
- Physical or mental health issues
- Poverty
- Traumatic life events
- Grief and loss

These experiences can have devastating effects on a child's physical and emotional development. While each child will respond differently, the impacts may last a lifetime.

**Our aim is to reduce the risk of further harm to children by strengthening:**

- Social skills, self-esteem and confidence
- Relationships with peers
- Emotional resilience
- Family relationships
- Parenting skills
- Community connections
